6. Updates from attendees

Passion4Plants - Sarah & Rob Moores https://passion4plants.co.uk/

Is in its 3rd season at Oakwood Market Garden and is now successfully selling produce through veg boxes, their farm shop and at Oakwood Farmers Market.

Involved their local community through eg plant swaps and open garden days.

Collaborated with Damasq to set up bee hives to provide skills and wellbeing for members of the Leeds Syrian community.

Particular focus on building heathy soil, including ramping up compost production with support from Compost-It and Yorkshire Mushroom Emporium.

Horsforth Community Garden- Penny Pinn https://www.horsforthcommunitygarden.co.uk

Received a £2k ChangeX Open Orchard grant for cordon and espalier apple trees, a plum and a greengage plus fruit bushes planted. They have nearly finished their raised beds. Cooperative grant to be received shortly, they will be contacting local organisations to arrange sessions in the garden this season.

Horsforth Community composting- Penny Pinn

Horsforth Community food growing- Penny Pinn

Has interest from several places including the Children's Centre, a church and an allotment with a community plot. Will be promoted at Horsforth Climate Action AGM this weekend.

My Place - Lisa Chamberlain & Abbie Melia

This group are based in Middleton. With lots of local community help and support they started with 1 tomato and now have lots of raised beds to use. They work with 33 care leavers and unaccompanied asylum children involving them in growing, cooking and building skills and community in Middleton.

Supports local small food businesses including MVUF and Kirkstall Farm. Operates plastic free. Works with Plate2 Plate on food waste. Gives to Leeds refugee Charities, the Foodbank at Woodhouse and any surplus to the Pay as Your Feel cafe run by Rainbow Junktion.

IE supports, inspires and enables over 20 groups growing veg etc in public places. Obtained National Lottery Funding to enable this. Working on access to land issues with LCC and on the "Right to Grow" on public land campaign.

The group now have 20 raised beds and work on Climate Resilience. They have a Little Veg Library, a community orchard and hold community events. They are aiming to hold a harvesting event this year.

Yorkshire Mushroom Emporium – Ed Elcock & Niall Johnston

They have been established for 3 years, growing edible fungi and selling kits. They have overcome lots of issues and now want to connect more with others e.g. who may want some of their waste mushroom compost. They also aim to provide workshops and tours, etc. They are deciding on their organisational structure and business model.

Fruit Works- Alan Thornton and Gini Morandi https://www.fruitworks.org.uk/

Workers Co-op, based in Leeds. they work across Bradford and Leeds with community groups and in over 50 Bradford schools. They offer pruning services and learning sessions; help establish community orchards; and manage an old orchard from which they harvest and sell the apples. There are more community orchards in the areas than across most of Europe!

Meet (on zoom) every 6 weeks.

We are working on the farm supply strand of Leeds Food Strategy, with SUSTAIN + NRFC members + Leeds University Research Staff.

Includes work on a feasibility study for a Northern bean processing unit(s) and developing a local 'Yorkshire Menu' of foods grown/ harvested in Yorkshire Region.

<u>Living Potential Care Farm – Kirsty Verner https://www.livingpotentialcarefarming.org.uk/</u>

Based at Sicklinghall, near Wetherby, works with young people with autisim. They have just started work in the walled garden having obtained funding for therapy work there.

<u>Grow to School – Ama Chaney https://www.growtoschool.co.uk/</u>

have developed food growing resources linked to the curriculum with nature-based activities. Work in Kirklees and Bradford and further. They get funding to deliver this in schools or schools can pay themselves. They work with 50 to 60 schools a year to embed sustainability into the school system.

Compost-It - Husain Algogaily, Niraj Sunil and Simrun Punjabi

Group aims to facilitate increased food-waste recycling by connecting households to local composters.

Their work is comprised of three core elements:

Collection - Flexible, convenient food-waste collection on demand for households within Leeds, with free caddy bins provided too for storage.

Connection - Virtual Community Composting Networks, which are digital communities centred around local composters. These provide a space for communication and mutually beneficial collaboration for food-waste recycling and beyond, between households, local composters, and the wider community.

Education - Concise, easy-to-understand educational resources surrounding important sustainability-based subjects, mainly focused on food-waste but also including more general topics.

<u>Kirkstall Farm CSA – Rhian Williams https://kirkstallvalleyfarm.org.uk/</u>

The growers and volunteers on their 16 acres of farmland now produce 100 veg boxes a week; funding from these pays the growers wages and seed purchases. They have trained a new grower and got the second polytunnel up. They offer regular Open Days. They also host a 'hungry holiday' scheme and other community events.

Food Wise Leeds Food Partnership - Sonja Woodcock https://foodwiseleeds.org/

Working to deliver the Leeds Food Strategy (https://www.leeds.gov.uk/plans-and-strategies/leeds-food-strategy) with Leeds CC. The current focus is working with other Food Partnerships across the Region, as many food supply sources are Region-wide, not local to Leeds.

Our agreement with West Leeds Activity Centre is coming to an end so we are looking for a new site for tree growing, public sales, and delivering training. We are one of only two fruit tree nurseries in West Yorkshire and a good local employer. We would be grateful of your help to find a new site based on our requirements below:

Essential

At least 0.25 acre minimum and relatively flat.

Fertile soil free from contamination

Vehicle access for our van and for lorry deliveries. Space to park at least 1 van.

Access to mains water

Secure from ASB and deer

 $\label{lem:control_problem} \mbox{Able to have public access at least once a week for tree sales, workshops, volunteering, etc.}$

5-year lease with rent to be negotiated

Desirable

Shelter and storage Electricity Rabbit-proof Within Leeds ring road

Details: I'm working with School food matters and we have funds available to work with a Leeds school in 2024. We would like to expand our Welcome gardening sessions, which are therapeutic in nature. The aim is to support the children to feel connected to the school and community, and for them to enjoy all the mental health benefits brought by group gardening sessions. We've been running these sessions for a couple of years, and they are really lovely.

We run 8 sessions in each school (primary or secondary)

For a group of about 12 asylum-seeking or refugee children (6 vulnerable children who each choose a buddy to attend with them)

The sessions run roughly fortnightly from the end of March/beginning of April to July

Each session is about 2 hours long
